How much do you get paid on a drilling rig?

Caodc updated its recommended wage schedule for drilling rigs on November 1st. The wages are only accessible to Caodc members right now but from memory: Driller: \$42 Derrickhand: \$36 Motorhand: \$31 Roughneck: \$29 Leasehand: \$28 Rig technician premiums are still in place. ~5% cut for everyone. Wages had been cut in the previous update (July).

Do drilling rig employees work overtime?

Drilling rig employees will usually work overtime, and many contractors will offer comprehensive benefits packages. Most drilling rig crews have six positions: Rig Manager (Tool Push), Driller, Derrickhand, Motorhand, Floorhand, and Leasehand. The Rig Manager is the senior supervisor on site, and is in complete charge of the rig.

How many hours a day does a drill rig work?

On these crews, the entry-level position is Floorhand. Drilling rigs typically operate 24 hours per day, seven days per week. To do so, most rigs have two or three crews that work 12-hour shifts on schedules offsetting one another. Day and night crews will alternate so each crew has a chance to work days and nights.

How many rig crew positions are there?

Most drilling rig crews have six positions: Rig Manager (Tool Push), Driller, Derrickhand, Motorhand, Floorhand, and Leasehand. The Rig Manager is the senior supervisor on site, and is in complete charge of the rig. He is responsible for the rig crews, the equipment, and the overall operation.

What is the drilling and service rig industry in Canada?

The drilling and service rig industry in Canada is very unique in that the equipment, vehicles, and processes are very specialized. As operations extend across Canada, they tend to fall under various regulations and legislation that was never intended for this industry.
