



Drilling rig slang

What does pig mean on a rig?

Pig: A device inserted into pipelines for cleaning or inspection. **Pusher:** Short for toolpusher; the person in charge of drilling operations on the rig. **Queen:** A derogatory term for someone avoiding work or taking excessive breaks. **Rat Hole:** A hole on the rig floor used to store the kelly when not in use.

What does roughneck mean on a drilling rig?

Commonly found on older drilling rigs that do not have a Top Drive. **ROP** Rate of penetration - the rate at which you are drilling. **Roughneck** Person that works in the Oilfield but not in management. **Roughneck and Rig Hand** both refer to the same position on a rig.

What is the difference between a drill rig and a dope?

Dope: A thick lubricant used on pipe connections. **Drill string:** A column, or string, of pipe that transmits drilling fluid (via the mud pumps) and torque (from the Kelly drive or top drive) to the drill bit. **Driller:** The crew supervisor on a drilling rig, working under the toolpusher.

What is a drilling fluid?

Used to describe any method for retrieving oil from a well and bringing it to the surface after the well ceases to produce. Solid or high-viscosity hydrocarbons found in natural deposits or in petroleum refining residue that are used as additives of oil- and water-based muds (drilling fluids).

What does put out mean on a rig?

Put-out A common phrase said in the oil patch referring to the effort your giving. This phrase would hold the same meaning if somebody said "put your back into it." **Ex:** worms don't put out. **Rat Hole** A storage place for the Kelly when the rig is not drilling. Commonly found on older drilling rigs that do not have a Top Drive.

What is coring in oil & gas drilling?

Coring: A procedure where a small amount of rock sample is extracted from an oil well to the surface to give valuable information during the drilling process about the rock in the well. **CSG** (coal seam gas) or **CBM** (coal bed methane): Methane that forms in the gaps between coal molecules.

o **Bell nipple:** An enlarged pipe at the top of a casing string that serves as a funnel to guide drilling tools into the top of the well.
o **Big bear:** A big bear is a hitch (see hitch) that lasts a minimum of 50 straight days.
o **Black Leg :** Joints of pipe racked back in the derrick.
