How many drillships are in the US Gulf?

The US Gulf counts many of the world's highest specification drillships among its fleet and generally commands some of the highest day rates in the world for units working in benign waters. The region's total drillship supply is 23, all of which are marketed.

How many jobs are there in the Gulf of Mexico?

It's been estimated that oil rigs in the Gulf of Mexico directly employ somewhere between 10,000 to 12,500 workers. The total number of directly and indirectly supported jobs by the offshore industry is 62,500, which is 3.3 percent of the total employment in the state of Louisiana.

Is drilling allowed in the Gulf of Mexico?

The federal government has not allowed drilling in federal waters in the eastern Gulf of Mexico, which includes offshore Florida and part of offshore Alabama, since 1995.

Will the US Gulf remain a top location for drillship activity?

"Longer term, the US Gulf will remain one of the top locations in the world for drillship activity," Edralin said. A new generation of floating production platform is being built and designed for the deepwater Gulf of Mexico.

What if US Gulf drillships are off-hire?

Should the region reach the fourth quarter with seven units off-hire, this would drop the marketed utilization rate to 70%. The last time US Gulf drillship utilization was this low was in mid-2018, which was during the extended global industry downturn.

How far do oil rigs drill?

Some rigs drill as far down as 2 kilometers beneath the surface. The Gulf of Mexico has nearly 125 oil rigs in operation. The first known offshore drilling happened in Azerbaijan in the 19th century.
