How many rigs drilling for oil in Canada?

More recently, on 10 July 2020 there were 6 rigs drilling for oil in Canada. In June the number of rigs drilling for either oil or gas averaged 18 per day, the lowest number since at least 1964, when data for all Canadian drilling was first recorded. Global investment in oil and gas has decreased significantly because of much lower oil prices.

Are rigs drilling for oil a seasonal trend in Canada?

Rigs drilling for oil display a seasonal pattern in Canada. In 2019, rigs drilling for oil increased from 17 at the beginning of May to 84 by the last week of June. Over the same time period in 2020, rigs drilling for oil in Canada decreased from 7 to 4. Canadian oil rig activity differs from the U.S. because Canadian drilling is largely seasonal.

Do I need to enter a rig daily or monthly?

CAOEC Members are required to enter daily (Drilling Members) and monthly (Drilling and Service Rig Members) as a condition of membership. What does moving a rig mean?

"Moving": The rig is in transit, on standby, on rig watch, billing at a non-drilling rate, or performing other non-drilling activities such as rig-up. "Down": The rig is down or racked. The rig is not billing an operator. "Registered Fleet": Drilling or service rigs registered with CAOEC.

CAOEC works with members to build a record of rig activity data. We produce daily, weekly and monthly rig counts for members, and publish weekly and monthly rig counts for the ...

Between 2001 and 2006, oil wells made up about 25% of rig activity, and gas wells 75%. The drilling industry reacted to this demand by expanding the fleet. In 2007, the rig fleet grew faster ...
